APA Idaho's Mission Statement

Advocate for effective planning programs, practices and legislation statewide. To this end, we shall provide resources, training, monitoring, mentoring, communications, lobbying, and other services to, and for all Idaho professional, student, and citizen planners. These activities shall help to assure that Idaho's planners are professionally knowledgeable and empowered to create and implement balanced, informed and visionary plans for their communities.

STRATEGIC PLANNING FRAMEWORK

The Idaho Chapter of the American Planning Association's Executive Board met on January 19, 2022 for a Strategic Planning Workshop. The Board worked through a series of discussion topics designed to prioritize and synchronize resources in order to implement our Chapter's mission statement and develop a work plan for the next three (3) years. The Board evaluated and discussed the results of a Strategic Planning Survey that was sent to membership and others on the 300-person distribution list in early 2022, and also reviewed Board member priorities and rankings. This Strategic Plan is an effort to move the chapter forward in a direction that is beneficial to members, the profession of planning within the State of Idaho, and the communities we serve.

Idaho as a whole is experiencing unprecedented change; this has resulted in significant stress to planning professionals across the state. There are more new planners than we have ever seen, faster turnovers, promotions and higher levels of burnout than is sustainable to the profession. Increasing grassroot efforts have resulted in more elected and appointed officials with significant need for a fundamental knowledge of local land use planning matters. The influx of new Idaho residents moving from other states with different views of growth, fiscal policies and laws that don't mirror Idaho laws have created more confusion and political pressures on elected and appointed officials at the local level, and similar challenges for planning professionals. Similarly open spaces and working lands continue to be converted to meet growth demands, infrastructure is failing across the state without adequate funding to make necessary repairs and upgrades, and housing prices are unsustainable for the workforce. Idaho communities continue to balance local control with a framework from the State. These critical issues and realities have driven the Board to outline a Strategic Plan that is designed to strengthen the organization and provide more support for planners and Idaho communities.

- Loop in and actively recruit members for volunteer opportunities to expand succession planning
- Support and develop Region Representatives as connections to local communities throughout the State
- Continue to evaluate membership and reach out to underserved and inactive areas to identify needs, show value, and grow the organization with recruitment efforts
- Identify state-level committees and opportunities for APA ID members to participate
- Identify Committees (based on the restructured Bylaws) to assist with the organization's mission and better support Board members. Begin filling the committees with volunteers in 2022 and 2023.
